

Highlights of LWV ABC Board Meeting, 9/24/2018

The LWV ABC Board meets on the fourth Monday of each month, usually at the [Davanni's in Coon Rapids](#) (see earlier story for info on the July 23 meeting which will be held at the Anoka County Historical Society). All members and invited to attend; we gather at 11 and order lunch, then eat while we meet, ending around 1pm. At each meeting, we review the treasurer's report and discuss matters relating to upcoming meetings, projects and more.

Voter Service reports that attendance at our candidate forums this Fall is definitely up, averaging about 60 people attending each forum. We have held a large number of forums this Fall, with one of our larger ones coming up on October 11th. It will be a forum done in collaboration with the Ham Lake and East Bethel Chambers of Commerce at Majestic Oaks Golf Club.

The newly opened Torg Brewery in Spring Lake Park is quite beautiful, with no accessibility issues. We plan to hold our Drafts and Discourse meetings there, starting in October 17th. Possible discussion topics include a New York Times survey on parental influence on gender identity.

We are continuing to look into how we might help Cedar Creek Ecosystem Science Reserve in getting signage on the county road that visitors must cross to walk to their Cedar Lake Bog. Suggestions included contacting Gene Merriam and Carroll Henderson, newly retired head of the DNR.

Voter Service has many exciting volunteer opportunities for members fall. Look them over, and let Geri Nelson or Arlene Gillett know which ones interest you, and we will get more information to you about them. Reply to lwvabc@lwvmn.org if you can help with any of these important and fulfilling volunteer opportunities.

1 - **Fair Vote**. This is a state-wide project to look into the possibilities of Rank Choice Voting. Members are asked to work at the Fair Vote MN booth at the Anoka County Fair. League is doing a study on Rank Choice Voting, and we currently support it as a choice if the community wants it.

2 - League will be participating in the **Secretary of State's Mock Election** in state high schools again this fall. We coordinate with the state office to sign schools up for it, and then offer our assistance in setting it up, helping with the actual voting in the schools and in some cases, totaling the results. Many volunteers are needed in order to cover as many schools as possible.

3 - High School student voter registration. League goes to area high schools in the spring and fall to offer on-site voter registration to eligible students. We contact the social studies teachers or guidance counselors, tell them about it and set up a date for our visit. We usually need 2 - 3 volunteers per high school, and we try to go to every high school in Anoka County. Enthusiasm for voter registration was high last spring, and we anticipate it will continue to be high this fall. Consider doing this - it is a lot of fun, and very satisfying to be a big part of the whole election process.
