LWV ABC 79th ANNUAL MEETING



Katherine Tomsich, LWV Minnesota Democracy Task Force, cochair, is the keynote speaker for the 79th LWV ABC Annual Meeting, 5:30 p.m., Monday, April 10, at the Andover Senior Center, 1685 Crosstown Boulevard NW, Andover. She will present information on League legislative activity concerning the priorities of protecting Minnesota's election system, redistricting reform, and money in politics.

Ms. Tomsich will provide a workshop on *Local Leagues = Grass Roots Power* during the 2017 bi-annual state convention, May 28-29. Information about the convention is provided in another article in this newsletter.

Ms. Tomsich began her association with the League at LWV ABC, later transferring to the White Bear Lake Area LWV. She joined the state Action Committee to follow bills affecting immigrants in Minnesota and then switched to election law to fight the Voter ID constitutional amendment. Her Democracy Task Force responsibilities focus on LWV Minnesota's legislative priorities.

The Annual Meeting is the most important business meeting of the League year. It is the entire membership's opportunity to direct the course of LWV ABC.

The Annual Meeting has four basic goals:

- 1. To elect a slate of officers representative of the membership.
- 2. To adopt a local program on governmental issues which reflects the interests of the membership and to re-adopt or drop present local positions.
- 3. To adopt a budget that provides for the financial support of the League as a whole.
- 4. To review and/or amend local League bylaws.
